A Message from the Pastor

November 1, 2015
All Saints

Dear parishioners,

Next weekend our 11:30 a.m. Sunday Mass will be our annual "Remembrance Mass," during which we will pray by name for parish loved ones who have died in the past year. All are welcome to come to this Mass. We're grateful to the parish ministry team who organizes the prayerful tribute and prepares the family brunch that follows.

Our parish also celebrates a novena of Masses with the special intention of "All Souls." These regularly scheduled Masses begin with the 9 a.m. weekday Mass on Monday November 2 (the memorial of The Commemoration of All The Faithful Departed). It continues through the weekday 9 a.m. Masses held in our rectory chapel Monday-Friday November 2-6 and through the weekend Masses November 7-8. These Masses in a special way are offered for those for whom you have asked prayers with the notes accompanying your All Souls envelope offerings.

If you're reading this, it's probably because you came to Mass and brought this home with you – and that's a great thing! Bringing the bulletin home is a great way to stay informed all week long about parish activities and schedules – that's why we produce it.

I do have one request. Sometimes after Masses we find folded, crumpled or discarded bulletins in the pews or on the floor. I'm reminded of the old "rule" that we had in Scouts when I was growing up whenever we went hiking or camping: we were supposed to leave the site cleaner than we found it. It would be a great courtesy to one another and a sign of respect for our church building if we could all try to apply that to our time together at Mass, too. It's better if those arriving after you don't have to deal with used tissues, water bottles, cereal, candy wrappers, etc.

It would also be helpful to your fellow parishioners if after Mass ends and before you leave if we could each remember to put the hymn books back neatly in the pew shelf. We'd like to take care of the hymnals we use, and make the church attractive for those following us. Also, if you misplaced anything, please be sure to mention it to the sacristan, or check the small "lost and found" basket on the bulletin table near the front door. Thank you!

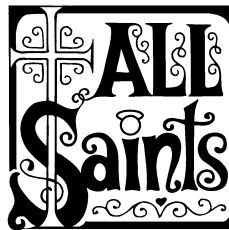

NEW PARISH ORGAN

The new organ is here and sounds beautiful! We replaced our old organ, which was deemed irreparable, with a new organ. The organ company agreed to apply the entire purchase price (\$6,000) of our old organ toward the purchase of a brand new organ. After much research an organ was chosen at a reduced cost of \$32,420 was ordered and purchased.

With the approval and support of our parish trustees and Finance Council, the funds for this unbudgeted purchase will come from the separate "Capital Campaign" account, so it will not affect our regular budgeting. However, it is still an expense of some significance. If you would like to make a restricted donation to help cover the cost, we would gratefully welcome it. Any donation should include a notation on the memo line: "Restricted – organ purchase." The congregation's singing is an essential part of the church's worship, and the organ has pride of place.

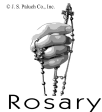

YOUTH NEWS

Mini Family Bible Study

Reading: 1 John 3:1-3

Read through the complete passage to start then go through the verses asking questions such as:

v.1 "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know Him."

Questions: What does it really mean to be a child of God? How should it affect the way that we see ourselves? How should it affect the way that we see others? What does John mean when he says "the world does not know us"? As a Christian do you ever feel misunderstood or prejudged by people because of your faith?

v.2 "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when He is revealed, we will be like Him, for we will see Him as He is."

Questions: Children take after their parents, so if we are children of God what should we be like? How can we grow in our understanding of who God is? How can grow in virtue to be more like God?

v.3 "And all who have this hope in Him purify themselves, just as He is pure."

Questions: Why does it take hope to believe that we will be like God? Do we hope in the Lord always? What might stop us from hoping in God? What are some practical ways that we can make it a habit to hope in good times and bad?
