On Thursday, September 14, the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, The Most Reverend Christophe Pierre, will impose the Pallium on Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., sixth Archbishop of Newark, in a special Mass to be celebrated in the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark. The Mass is set to begin at 2:00 p.m. All are welcome to attend, and you are asked to be seated in the Cathedral by 1 p.m.

The pallium is a special liturgical garment worn only by Metropolitan Archbishops – those prelates who preside over an ecclesiastical province. The Province of New Jersey consists of the Archdiocese of Newark and the Dioceses of Trenton, Camden, Paterson and Metuchen. A narrow circular band of white lamb's wool with two bands hanging from front to back, the pallium is decorated with six black crosses that recall the wounds of the crucified Christ and adorned with three pins that symbolize the nails of the Crucifixion. It is worn around the neck. The Holy Father bestows a Pallium as a symbol of an Archbishop's close relationship to the Holy See.

The Mass of Imposition of the Pallium will be the first such liturgy to take place in the Cathedral Basilica in 63 years. Archbishops Peter L. Gerety and John J. Myers, and Cardinal Theodore McCarrick each received the pallium directly from the Holy Father in liturgies that took place at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Two community events this week warrant your attention. I hope you'll consider joining me at these supportive gatherings. The annual 9/11 candlelight memorial service will be Monday September 11<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. at Crestwood Park. On Wednesday September 13<sup>th</sup>, at 7 p.m. at the Red Barn at Crestwood Lake, a candlelight vigil will be held to remember those who have died due to addiction and to help ease the stigma surrounding addiction. This vigil is sponsored by the bereavement group, "Hope and Healing After An Addiction Death."

## Statement of Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark On the Rescission of DACA Executive Order

The decision to phase out the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals executive order is malicious.

It is plainly and clearly wrong for this Administration to use as a political tool the lives, futures and security of some 800,000 young people whose only crime, if you ever could call it that, was that they lovingly and obediently accompanied their parents in pursuit of the dream of freedom and opportunity.

Whether or not the previous administration had authority to institute DACA does not matter. The 800,000 Dreamers affected by the rescission are people. They live in our neighborhoods, attend our schools, fight for our country, and contribute actively in our workplaces. They are contributing to this nation's future and prosperity. They have followed the rules that have been in place, always praying that Congress would step up to the plate and craft intelligent, heartfelt long term solutions to a broken immigration system.

One can't hide behind the term "legality" in rescinding DACA. That is an abandonment of humanity, and abandonment of talented and hopeful young people who are as American as you and I.

The rule of law, first, last and always, must provide a humane, moral code to organize, protect and advance society based on the best ideals and beliefs in our hearts and minds. Catholic teaching calls all people to make a commitment to uphold the dignity of every person and to work for the common good of our nation. Rescinding DACA without having in place through Congress an equivalent and permanent protection for these Americans does not advance society or exemplify our best ideals and beliefs. It is, rather, an abandoning of humanity.

Today, the Administration not only has closed borders; it also has closed minds and hearts.

### Hurricane Irma

Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Archbishop of Newark, asks all people of the Archdiocese to pray for the safety of those who are in the path of Hurricane Irma.

The Archdiocese of Newark is home to many thousands of people who trace their roots to the Caribbean islands of Cuba, US Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, Haiti, the Dominican Republic and the Bahamas, so the effects of Hurricane Irma will be felt not only on the people of these islands and in our southern United States, but also on people here in New Jersey. Of special importance to the Archdiocese is the fate of the nearly 32,000 inhabitants and additional thousands of visitors of the Turks & Caicos Islands, which the Vatican has placed into the spiritual care of the Archbishop of Newark.

Over the two decades that the *Missio sui iuris* (independent mission) of Turks & Caicos Islands has been under the care of the Archbishop of Newark, the Archdiocese has established parishes, schools and outreach centers to serve the people there, many of whom are poor and refugees from other islands. In 2008, Hurricane Gustave and Tropical Storm Hanna pummeled the people of Turks & Caicos, and caused destruction to buildings of the mission, yet the priests of the Archdiocese stationed on the islands of the mission continue to meet their spiritual and physical needs.

The Cardinal asks that all Catholics keep our brothers and sisters in the Caribbean and especially the Turks & Caicos mission in our prayers at this time.

**September 10, 2017**

**23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

*"You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel." - EZEKIEL 33:7*

Many of us are generous with our gifts. However, how often is our generosity at the minimum level required? We do just enough or give just enough. Remember, the Lord calls us to be generous with all the gifts He has given us, to grow them and return them with increase.

## **HURRICANE RELIEF**

*If you missed our parish collection for hurricane relief, or want to make additional donations, you may send contributions directly to Catholic Charities USA. From their website:*

Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA), the official domestic relief agency of the Catholic Church, is ... taking action toward assisting in (hurricane) recovery efforts. 100% of funds raised are going to those affected.

Sister Donna Markham OP, PhD, president and CEO of CCUSA, (was) in San Antonio on Labor Day in order to present nearly \$2 million in aid to local Catholic Charities agencies. All funds raised will go to the agencies that are helping families and individuals with shelter, food, and other recovery needs, both immediate and long-term.

CCUSA is also sending to the impacted areas its Disaster Mobile Response Center vehicle, which was presented to CCUSA just last week by the Ford Motor Company. The vehicle was packed with supplies – diapers, bleach, and mosquito repellent – by CCUSA staff members and (sent) to San Antonio, where it will be used by local Catholic Charities agencies.

The CCUSA Disaster Recovery Team is coordinating the relief efforts from the Catholic Charities nationwide network. The impacted agencies have been asked to list their specific needs, including the number and amounts of gift cards and gas cards. CCUSA will then distribute the list to other Catholic Charities agencies and manage the disbursements. In addition to basic supplies, CCUSA will provide technical assistance, the deployment of staff from other agencies, as well as short term and long term recovery grants.
