Migration Facts
Prepared by the United States
Conference of Catholic Bishops
In observation of National Migration Week
January 8-14, 2017

Immigration Reform

Position: The Catholic Bishops and the Church support humane immigration reform. We must reform our broken system that separates families and denies due process.

Facts:

- * Since 2010, 3.6 million immigrants have become naturalized US citizens.
- * Unauthorized immigrants also pay a wide range of taxes, including sales taxes where applicable and property taxes – directly if they own and indirectly if they rent. Estimates state that unauthorized migrants pay an estimated 11.64 billion dollars every year in state and local taxes.
- * It can take upwards of a decade for legal permanent residents to reunify with immediate family members from Mexico, the Philippines, and other countries. (Congressional Research Service)

Refugee Protection

Position: USCCB is the largest private refugee resettlement agency in the United States, helping to resettle more than one million refugees in the United States since 1975.

Facts:

- * The top five populations resettled during Fiscal Year (FY) Y2015: Congo, Syria, Burma, Iraq, and Somalia.
- * 12,000 Syrian refugees resettled in the United States since the start of the Syrian civil war in 2011. (Department of State, Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration)
- * According to the United Nation's High Commissioner for Refugees, more than 66 million persons were displaced in the world at the end of 2015. (UNHCR)

Unaccompanied Children and Families from Central America

Position: Unaccompanied children arrive at our borders without their parent or legal guardian with them. In recent years, many of these children were from El Salvador, Guatemala and Honduras. Most are fleeing grave violence, gang recruitment and are seeking to reunify with family in the United States.

Facts:

- * In FY 2015, Mexico deported 165,000 Central Americans. The number detained in Mexico has tripled in the past four years amid growing pressure and economic support from the US to stem the flow. (The Guardian)
- * 73% of unaccompanied children who had legal representation won their immigration case in the United States, compared to 15% who were unrepresented. (American Bar Association)

Immigrant Detention

Position: Immigrant detention is a growing industry in this country, with Congress allocating as much as \$2 billion

CENTER FOR FOOD ACTION

2016 Center for Food Action(CFA) Update

On behalf of the Center for Food Action, the Food Pantry Ministry would like to thank the Guardian Angel community for generously donating to the CFA throughout 2016. The final totals for the year are: 600 bags and 39 boxes of food and personal items (weighing over 7584 lbs. - excluding last week of Jan.) and \$201.00 in monetary donations! There were 124 boxes of pancake mix, 89 bottles of pancake syrup, and 60 boxes of instant potatoes donated as the **Showcase Items** in December. The Center has identified **Cans of Tomatoes** as needed items for the month of January. This month our weekly goal is to collect **85 Cans of Tomatoes per week** to support the number of families the CFA serves on a weekly basis. **If each parish family donates at least one Can of Tomatoes on a weekly basis throughout January, we can meet our goal.** Donations can be dropped off at the Food Pantry in the back of the Church. a year to maintain and expand it. Due to mandatory detention laws people 6 who are not flight risks or risks to national security and are extremely vulnerable, such as asylum-seekers, families, and victims of human trafficking, are being held unnecessarily in detention.

Facts:

- * In FY2015 the Department of Homeland Security detained 406,595 immigrants compared to 486,651 in FY2014; it is required that 34,000 beds are filled each day. (Department of Homeland Security)
- * Community-based alternatives to detention programs cost on average \$10.55 per person per day, as compared to \$164 per person per day for detention. (GAO)

Human Trafficking

Position: Human trafficking is defined as the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services through the use of force, fraud, or coercion, for the purpose of subjecting that person to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery. The Catholic Church has long objected to this practice as an affront to human dignity.

Facts:

- * Estimates vary, but as many as 17,500 persons are trafficked into the United States annually.
- * Although sex trafficking remains a serious problem, the two largest trafficking cases in the United States involved labor trafficking, in Guam and in New York (Long Island).

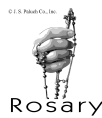
Guardian Angel is a tithing parish. Biblical tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your Parish Church.

The following is an invitation to support a Catholic outreach mission trip. The participant, college student Erin Tryon, was a youth altar server here at Guardian Angel Church, and serves occasionally as a lector here when she is home from college.

Father Charlie

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What do you think of when you think of Jamaica? For many, it may be imagined as a vacation spot for tourists to enjoy a relaxing time at the beach. To be honest, I'd mostly thought of it in this way before I investigated the country a bit more. What I found was that the place is one of shocking disparity: wealth exists there, but alongside terrible poverty, illness, and neglect. Whole groups of people, such as those with HIV/AIDS or severe handicaps, are marginalized completely. It is often the children who suffer the most, lost in the wayside, without fathers or mothers to care for them.

In the midst of these difficulties are bright spots of hope and love. One of those bright spots is a ministry called Mustard Seed Communities. This spring break, I have the opportunity to serve for a week on a mission trip with this Catholic organization.

I am deeply involved with Radford University's Catholic Campus ministry. I will be attending, along with other students from this ministry, an Alternative Spring Break trip with Mustard Seed Communities. This Catholic organization serves over 500 children, young adults and families who belong to the most vulnerable groups in Jamaican society. The populations of their communities include children and young adults with disabilities, children affected by HIV/AIDS, and teen mothers along with their babies. They also manage a number of community outreach programs to combat poverty and provide education to local populations. While we are in Jamaica for a week, we will be ministering to a community of twenty children, aged 2-17, all of whom have physical or mental disabilities. I look forward to developing personal relationships with those that we will meet: surely we will see the face of Christ in them! We will care for them, love them, and help build up their community in whatever ways are needed, showing that the love of God extends to all people. In so doing, I hope that they see Christ in us, too.

I am writing you this letter to ask you to partner with me on this mission trip. I covet your prayers- for these initial stages of preparation all the way to our travels back to the States. Please consider including me, our team, and the children of Jamaica we will meet in your prayers. In addition I am also hoping you will consider partnering with me financially. To support the children we will serve, I need to raise \$1600. Your donation would change the lives of children who have no family and nowhere else to go by ensuring that they receive love and quality care. Children's Church has continued to be very popular this year and after a short break will resume this weekend at 11:30 Mass. This is an opportunity for young children to participate in a special liturgical experience created just for them.

- * All children in grades K – 3 are invited to participate at 11:30 Mass on Sundays.
- * The children come to Mass and sit with their families at the beginning of Mass.
- * They are then called forward and process with the adult team to the vestibule.
- * For the readings and homily, the children hear the same scripture as the older participants, but the language is on their level.
- * Usually a question and answer period follows the Gospel reading.
- * After a short closing prayer the children return to their families during the offertory to celebrate Mass together.

We hope that your children will participate in this on a regular basis. Since we understand that 11:30 Mass may not be the most convenient time for your family EVERY week, please know that participation in this program does not require a weekly commitment to this particular Mass. We are always looking for adult volunteers to help with this ministry. If this is something that might be of interest to you, please contact the Religious Ed office.
